VICAR'S ADDRESS

WELCOME TO ADVENT

ADVENT, CHRISTMAS AND EPIPHANY

Well November has flown by and we are now entering our season of Advent and preparation for Christmas. There is no Messenger publication in January. During December and January the church calendar covers the seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany.

A little about these seasons edited from "Seasons of the Spirit".

"Advent opens with Isaiah's visions of peace and harmony, and a reversal of power. I think this is a vision that we still long for today. We change the colours within our church, the altar frontals and the stoles we wear. The calming blue and purple of the season prompt us to slow down, pause, and get ready for Emmanuel, God with us. As we wait and get ready, we sing with Mary a song of joy and justice. We light an additional candle on our advent wreath and sing of peace, hope, love and joy

Finally, Christmas comes and the colours change to white/gold. These colours of the Christmas season warm our hearts and we join creation in a hymn of praise and all the old Christmas carols blended with some newer ones. The Season of Christmas concludes with the magi entering the story and beckoning us to embrace the hope in the gift of a child.

Epiphany carries the sense of renewal, appearing every year as the calendar year turns, but it also brings a sense of coming home, of returning to basics as we move ever onward on our spiritual journeys. In this Season, after the Epiphany, we still look to the heavens for guidance, following Christ who is our Morning Star.

We begin this season with the knowledge that we are **loved**, fully and completely by God. We hope



this knowledge helps us recognize we are **called, follow** and are **blessed** to do the work of God. That work is to both **shine** God's radiance into the world but also to **grow** in our personal and communal expressions of faith because the Season of Lent soon draws near. We close with the reminder that we are **sent** by God. In this and so many ways, our lives are not our own. In life and in death, we belong to God – a stark and yet vital truth as we move into death and life at Calvary and beyond."

So let us join in preparation for receiving the Christ Child afresh into our hearts and into our lives.

Amidst our preparation for Christmas there are a number of events on the parish calendar and we are hoping you will be able to join us. You will find these listed later in the Messenger.

I cannot let it pass without expressing our sincere sympathy to Lois Allen and her family at the passing of her husband John. John was a regular contributor to the Messenger and we valued his contribution to the parish and the community. He has certainly left his mark on the parish and in the memories of many people. In the words of a child: "He taught us so much and was so much fun." I just hope they retain all he taught them.

For Lois and many others the celebration of Christmas may bring some sadness as many memories of past times are recalled. It is important that we remember our loved ones in these special events in our year and to allow ourselves to acknowledge our pain and true feelings.

Christmas is the celebration of Christ coming into our world and into our lives and I pray that at Christmas and in the New Year this will bring you some comfort – love, peace, hope and joy.





SUSTAINABILITY

A group of parishioners who have worked with John Allen in a variety of ways are committed to ensuring that his work in our parish and community continues.



We are very keen to move ahead and some work has already begun on this. The water tank stand has been repaired and the trough is going to be filled with soil and planted.

Many thanks to Pauline and Renton Brown for the work they have completed in clearing the garden and planting some vegetables ready for use in summer.

We would appreciate some volunteers so we can develop a roster of people who could go down once a week and water the garden and also pull out the weeds as they appear. In February we will advertise for some people to actually join our garden group. We would appreciate any offers we can get now to help us through Christmas time to the end of January.

Planning is in progress for the development of the back area of the garden to enhance productivity. It is also our plan to continue "The Grow Your Own Food" and potentially other related courses if we can secure the services of an appropriate person to assist with this. We will update you on further developments.

- Take on the role of sustainability champion for our parish.
- Assist with the ongoing development of our communal garden.

FROM THE VESTRY

We have been successful in receiving a grant for a feasibility study for the restoring of St Andrew's Church.

Some investigation has already been under taken. The tree in the front of the church has been removed which was damaging the foundations. We know that the foundations and the western end of the building have also been damaged and hence the foundations are in need of attention. The brick structure of the building is also not up to the required standard for the earthquake requirements and the plaster work again needs resealing in places. There is quite a long period of time that we have to do this restoration but it is important that we get onto it.

The feasibility study will identify what needs to be done and make recommendations on how best to tackle the problem. There will be some estimates on possible costs. Once this information is received we will need to then proceed with making decisions on courses of action and getting some more accurate costings. We will need to apply for further grants and also try to secure support from the wider community.

Health and Safety Policy

A copy of the Parish Health and Safety Policy along with the processes required for the implementation of the policy is currently available on the shelf at the back of the church, published on our website or available from the parish office.

An evacuation plan is in each area for the church and complex.

Reid Anderson Hall: Assembly area is the car park adjoining the hall unless the location of the emergency situation is on the south wall preventing evacuation on that side of the building. In this case the assembly area is on the road frontage in front of the church.

Nora Brown Hall: Assembly area is on the road frontage in front of the church or on the vicarage lawn depending on the location of the emergency situation.

Other rooms in the complex Assembly area move to the vicarage lawn.

St Andrew's Church: Assembly area is on the road frontage at the front of the church.

St Paul's Church: Assembly area is on the road frontage at the front of the church.

First aid kits and accident reporting sheets are located:

- 1. Reid Anderson In the cupboard over the small hand basin, by the back door in the kitchen.
- 2. Nora Brown on the shelf above the microwave. Record sheets are next to the microwave.
- 3. Parish office 2nd to top shelf on left side in the back room. The office is locked when unattended.

Forms are to be completed as soon as the accident has been dealt with. Treatment including resources that are used are to be recorded on the sheet.
